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Garden to Table

Last week, Te Kokako, Pukeko and Korimako Lewis cooked a veggie tray bake with chickpeas and served it with a herb sauce and flatbread.

Mandarin up-side-down cake was on the menu too. We have been making the tray bake for quite a few sessions already and its always popular.

Roast veggies taste so much better when they have got a bit of char on them. It's also a good recipe to use when we only have smaller amounts of lots of different vegetables, because a wide range of harder vegetables can be cooked that way.

This week both Kotare classes and Korimako Peddle made minestrone soup with pesto and no-yeast bread rolls with herb and garlic butter.

Its always nice to have some warm soup on a cold winters day and the garlic butter rolls were a hit.

We baked the mandarin cake again, and with the horizontal cut mandarins looking like flowers, its very pretty as well as tasty.

A mix of all weathers over the last fortnight in the garden. We've had frosty mornings, a little bit of rain but also some glorious sunshine which we've made the most of. Last week Te Kokako finished preparing the pumpkin patch. With the weeds suppressed the whole area looks so tidy and underneath the mulch the soil will be improving for Spring. Pukeko had a cold rainy day so we worked inside; learning about the different parts of a plant that we are eating when we eat vegetables.



Garden to Table


Korimako Lewis sowed poppies and purple broccoli for our garden and fed and mulched our young citrus trees. This week Kotare sowed capsicum, chillies, eggplant and tomato, did some weeding and feeding of the garden beds and brewed up some comfrey tea - a smelly but effective fertiliser made from comfrey leaves and

chicken poo steeped in water. It will now sit for a few weeks until it is REALLY smelly and then we can feed it to our crops. Korimako Peddle will continue on Friday with more tomato varieties to sow. It is very satisfying to have the first of our Seedling Sale crops underway to sell at Calf Club next term.





A huge thanks to our Ōropi School Community for the amazing support of book week! We had so much fun colouring in, dressing up, writing stories and making things. 

ATTENDING SCHOOL

Oropi School is committed to ensuring that all of our students get the most out of their education, and wants to support our students to maintain regular attendance.

Students who attend school regularly learn more and achieve better results.

As parents, you have an important role in ensuring that your child attends school whenever it is open, unless there is a good reason for his/her absence. Acceptable reasons for absence include sickness or serious family circumstances, such as bereavement. Where there is a good reason for absence, please contact our school to let us know as soon as possible.

Your role in ensuring your child's regular attendance is so important that if you allow your child to miss school without a valid reason, you can be prosecuted under the Education Act 1989. While Oropi School does not want to prosecute any parent for their children's absence, we do take regular attendance seriously. We will be monitoring all unexplained absences and if students frequently miss school without an explanation being provided, we will be contacting parents to request a meeting and to work with you to encourage better attendance.

If the unexplained absences persist, we will send a formal warning letter, and may involve other agencies, such as the Truancy Service, to follow up on the reason for the absence.

Please work with us to support your child to attend school regularly.

Attendance is important and every day counts.
