We have been so busy in Ruru this week! From tea parties to cup stacking, there has been lots of learning happening.

SEEK IN RUP

Here we are making casts and gloves. We are measuring and cutting our fabric and using a hot glue gun to stick everything together. We are testing our products over and over to ensure that everything is up to quality! Once it fits perfectly, we are adding hearts and other colourful bits of fabric for decoration. Next week we are going to learn how to create our designs by sewing!

> We have all been in a mood for a party so we turned into little party planners and organised a tea party. We had our table set with a tablecloth, plates, and cups. We even made presents for each other and had cake. So fun!



We have enjoyed cup stacking for a few weeks now. We love challenging ourselves to make the tower higher and higher each time. Kicking the tower over although sad, is SO satisfying!

We watched videos of professional cup stackers. They stack so fast! We are going to challenge ourselves and see how fast we can stack our cups.



After a rainy first half of the term, we have finally had fine weather to enjoy for the past couple of weeks. We were lucky to win 120 seedlings from Zealandia - who supply the 6-cell punnets of vegetables and herb seedlings to garden centres so planting them out has filled our garden sessions. Our junior and middle classes have had lots of practice planting out and caring for all the varieties of lettuce, cabbage, broccoli, silverbeet, celery, cauliflower, beetroot, spinach and parsley that we won. Thank you for your support Zealandia!

Our chickens have been off the lay for a few weeks while they grow new feathers so Piwakawaka made them a nice bowl of warm porridge to help boost their protein. It must have done some good because later that morning we got our first egg for a month! With the weather cooling we have turned to winter classics in the kitchen. Ruru and Te Hokioi made a Pumpkin & Spring Onion Pasta Bake which is a delicious and more nutritious version of macaroni and cheese. On the side they made a Kale and Mandarin Salad and Tea Biscuits which incorporate three autumn fruits; mandarin, feijoa and persimmon. Piwakawaka and Kea made a warming Vegetarian Chilli in tortillas they made from scratch and an Apple, Feijoa and Rhubarb Crumble for dessert; one of those great recipes for any time of the year depending on which fruits are in season.

Last Friday we held an Open Day for visitors to see Garden to Table in action. We had a large group of guests from Fairhaven School, St Mary's and wonderful student leaders from Aorangi School in Rotorua. Kea were awesome role models for Ōropi School and on a beautiful Winter morning they showed off Garden to Table at its very best. Tino pai Kea!

ACCIDENTS AND ILLNESS AT SCHOOL

Teachers are on duty at all times during the morning and lunchtime breaks. Accidents of minor nature are treated at school in the sick bay/medical room. Parents, or a nominated adult are contacted if an accident is of a serious nature. If parents and designated emergency contacts are unable to be contacted, the school will use discretion in obtaining medical aid. Parents will be notified if their child becomes ill and needs care at home.

SIGN IN AND OUT

In case of an emergency and for our Health and safety reasons we need to know who is on the school grounds. We therefore ask that you use the ipad at the school reception desk to sign in and out.

Reasons you need to use the ipad:

- Child/ren are late. Sign in.
- Child/ren are leaving school for an appointment or because they are sick during school time. Sign out.
- Parent/friend/family member is helping during school hours or attending a class event. Sign in and out.

- Child/ren returning from an appointment. Sign in.

PARKING

CLOSING GATES

To ensure the safety of all children on site, please ensure the gate you enter and exit is securely closed once you pass through.

ATTENDING SCHOOL

Oropi School is committed to ensuring that all of our students get the most out of their education, and wants to support our students to maintain regular attendance. Students who attend school regularly learn more and achieve better results.

As parents, you have an important role in ensuring that your child attends school whenever it is open, unless there is a good reason for his/her absence. Acceptable reasons for absence include sickness or serious family circumstances, such as bereavement. Where there is a good reason for absence, please contact our school to let us know as soon as possible.

Your role in ensuring your child's regular attendance is so important that if you allow your child to miss school without a valid reason, you can be prosecuted under the Education Act 1989. While Oropi School does not want to prosecute any parent for their children's absence, we do take regular attendance seriously. We will be monitoring all unexplained absences and if students frequently miss school without an explanation being provided, we will be contacting parents to request a meeting and to work with you to encourage better attendance.

If the unexplained absences persist, we will send a formal warning letter, and may involve other agencies, such as the Truancy Service, to follow up on the reason for the absence. Please work with us to support your child to attend school regularly. Attendance is important and every day counts.

Keeping your contact details up to date

Remember to keep your contact information up to date with the office. We must be able to contact parents and caregivers if necessary, especially if your child is unwell. This includes your phone numbers, physical address, and email address.
