She talked with all staff and then had a parent session where we were able to hear about the role of play based learning and how it connects and relates to brain development, addressing the key competencies in learning and covering the curriculum. Really interesting stuff with lots to think about how we cater for all children. My biggest takeaway is that every child has a strength and it is our job to foster an environment where they can discover their strength, that we nurture.

Week 2 has evolved into one with a higher level of sickness circulating as the week has gone on amongst children and staff. There seems to be quite a mix of illnesses and infections circulating. Please be mindful of this and get your child checked if in doubt prior to sending to school so we can slow the spread of winter illnesses. This is for roll auditing purposes. As a school we encourage children and staff to take holidays during break times to ensure routines remain in place for children's learning. However, in saying this, we understand that many are travelling overseas again now that boarders are fully open again after a long period of not being able to do this.

You will have seen a post on our facebook page earlier in the week about our historic drilling for a new bore to replace our 50 year old bore for a new water supply. It is also our school's 125 year anniversary in 2024. A committee is being formed and we will first meet in the middle of August to get some initial ideas together for planning this milestone next year.

Garden to Table

Welcome back to Garden to Table for the senior classes. There are many different vegetables and fruits from when we last worked with these classes back in Term 1, with lots of root vegetables and winter greens this time of year.

Last week Te Kokako o Otanewainuku. Pukeko and Korimako Lewis cooked Pumpkin and Potato Gnocchi with a Winter Greens Pesto, Lettuce Salad with Honey Mustard Dressing and a delicious, sticky Coconut Slice with Lemon Syrup. Gnocchi is great fun to make from scratch; mixing the dough, forming the 'snakes' and slicing them into soft pillowy dumplings. While it is traditionally make with just mashed potato, we love the slight sweetness of pumpkin added. This week Kotare and Korimako Peddle are cooking a Mixed Veggie Traybake with Garlic and Herb Sauce, Herbed Flatbread and Pumpkin and Chocolate Mini Muffins. There were a few surprised faces at pumpkin going into a dessert but the sweetness and texture makes for delicious and moist cakes.

Korimako Lewis had a rainy day last week but the gardening crew got to do some seed shopping! There are hundreds of options of seeds to choose from but the garden crew researched which varieties would grow well in our climate and selected some awesome new types as well as some reliable favourites. Te Kokako did a great job getting the pumpkin patch ready for Spring; pulling the big weeds then laying cardboard, logs and mulch down to smother the weeds and feed the soil. Pukeko planted beetroot and broad beans, sowed spring onions, pruned back cherry tree shoots and compost office waste paper. Kotare planted coriander, red cabbage, snow peas and red lettuce. The enormous fennel plant has become old and unproductive so we pulled it out to start again; a herculean effort from Kotare Tappenden and 'Poppa Mike' who managed to lever the enormous fennel crown out of the soil and wrestle it into the orchard for the chickens to nibble the bugs off.



ATTENDING SCHOOL

Oropi School is committed to ensuring that all of our students get the most out of their education, and wants to support our students to maintain regular attendance.

Students who attend school regularly learn more and achieve better results.

As parents, you have an important role in ensuring that your child attends school whenever it is open, unless there is a good reason for his/her absence. Acceptable reasons for absence include sickness or serious family circumstances, such as bereavement. Where there is a good reason for absence, please contact our school to let us know as soon as possible.

Your role in ensuring your child's regular attendance is so important that if you allow your child to miss school without a valid reason, you can be prosecuted under the Education Act 1989. While Oropi School does not want to prosecute any parent for their children's absence, we do take regular attendance seriously. We will be monitoring all unexplained absences and if students frequently miss school without an explanation being provided, we will be contacting parents to request a meeting and to work with you to encourage better attendance.

If the unexplained absences persist, we will send a formal warning letter, and may involve other agencies, such as the Truancy Service, to follow up on the reason for the absence

Please work with us to support your child to attend school regularly.

Attendance is important and every day counts.
