Entries for Calf Club & Pet Day close on Monday 18 September.

Calves - must be born on or after 20 July 2023 Lambs - must be born on or after 1st August 2023 Goats - must be born on or after 1st August 2023 Chickens - must have been ordered through the school to enter in this category. Chickens must be caged separately for ease of judging. **Other Categories:** Open Pet - medium/large pet The medium / large section of pet day includes animals such as ponies, calves, sheep, goats, dogs, and cats. Children cannot enter their pet into this section if it is already entered into the Calf Club category but this is a great option for your friendly pet lamb from last year.

Open Pet - small pet

The small pet section includes animals such as rats, mice, guinea pigs, birds, bunnies, reptiles, chickens, and any other pet that would usually be kept in a cage or tank. All of these animals must have a pet profile or diary completed which is presented with the student's pet on the day.

Hanging Basket - One basket per child. Check the Calf Club update for more details.

Bird Box - One entry per child. Check the Calf Club update for more details.

Hobbit House - One entry per child. Check the Calf Club update for more details.

Scarecrow - Check the Calf Club update for more details.

Winter has finally moved on and to celebrate the beginning of spring we made one of the kids favorite dishes: Macaroni cheese... but with a vegetable twist. Last week Te Kokako and Pukeko added broccoli and leafy greens and this week both Kotare classes also had a big, white cauliflower to cut up. We did not waste the leaves either, they also got sliced up and added in.

A perfect side dish was a salad made with lovely lettuce from the garden and a sweet and sour honey mustard dressing.

For dessert last week we made jam drop biscuits, with homemade cherry guava jam. This week we used up some left over apples from the disco and baked apple and chocolate mini muffins with some lemon curd on the side.



The Kokako garden has enjoyed the recent sunshine, so much so that we actually had to water the garden last week - it feels like months since we've had to get the hose out! But the rain rejoined us this week, giving our Spring crops a good drink.

Seed-sowing for our upcoming Seedling Sale continues in earnest with all classes seeing exciting progress in the greenhouse. The warm conditions have made germination swift and productive so we will have a busy weeks ahead repotting them for sale. Te Kokako sowed three varieties of zucchini; Black Beauty, Cocozelle and Goldrush. Pukeko continued the cucurbits; sowing Jaune et Vert Squash, Sunbeam Squash and Crystal Apple Cucumber. Korimako Lewis sowed Blue Prince Pumpkins and did some tidying, weeding and planting jobs around the garden and welcomed visitors last Friday for an Open Day.

The Kotare classes gardened indoors due to the rain but we learned about companion planting, how we use it at Oropi School, and put our knowledge to use by sowing some companion plants; basil, cornflower and marigold. We have our fingers crossed for some fine weather on Friday for Korimako Peddle where we will see how our new worm farm is getting along and start potting up the seedlings that are large enough for sale.





The Enviro Club were fortunate to visit The Pendergrast Memorial Heritage Park to contribute to the current Kokako Corridor project, which involves planting trees to re-establish the corridor between Otanewainuku and Kaharoa. This native corridor was destroyed many years ago during the development of the area. Learning about the benefits of reestablishing this native bush area and being involved in the planting was a fantastic opportunity for our tamariki to understand the importance of engaging in sustainable practices and contributing to our Oropi Community.
