Garden to Table

A warm welcome back to our Junior and Middle classes to Garden to Table this term. The garden is bursting into life with ideal Spring conditions (warm and showery).

Last week our Pīwakawaka tamariki made
Broccoli Bites - like a baked meatball but made
with finely chopped broccoli florets and stalks - a
zingy citrus slaw and Citrus Mini Muffins. This
week's hero vegetable for Ruru, Te Hōkioi and Tui
is cabbage as they make Baked Cabbage Patties
with a Herb and Garlic Sauce and our popular
Citrus muffins again. We are dazzled by the
adventurous eaters this term - we had so many
completely clean plates, kids clamouring for
seconds of cabbage and broccoli and almost no
waste! Ka rawe!

Last week Pīwakawaka got our garden shipshape for Calf Club; tidying the beds, picking up the windfall fruit after the holidays and feeding our Spring crops. They picked up so many lemons, there was enough to make a 'lemonsnake' with them! They also sowed our first corn - which has already started germinating - more cucumber and planted mesclun lettuce seedlings.

This week Te Hōkioi sowed even more corn and pulled out our bolted broccoli plants from last term. Ruru had a busy morning sowing basil seeds - both green and purple varieties although we discovered the seeds look exactly the same in seed form. Tui will be doing some more weeding and feeding on Friday, and we will start planting our summer vegetables - exciting!



Health & Safety

PARKING

For the safety of everyone, please cross the road at the road crossing by the bus turning bay. Do not walk across the road on blind corner.

CLOSING GATES

MORNING DROP OFF

SIGN IN AND OUT

In case of an emergency and for our Health and safety reasons we need to know who is on the school grounds. We therefore ask that you use the ipad at the school reception desk to sign in and out if you are staying for longer than ten minutes.

- Parent/friend/family member is helping during school hours or attending a class event. Sign in and out.
